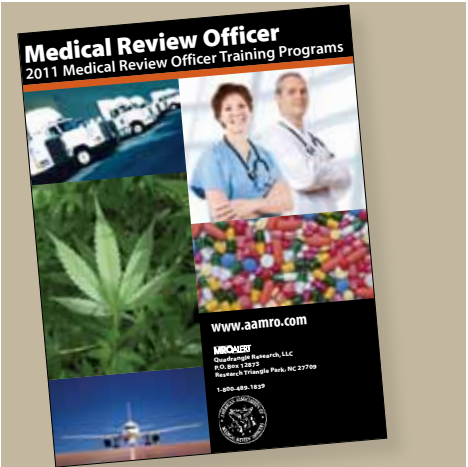
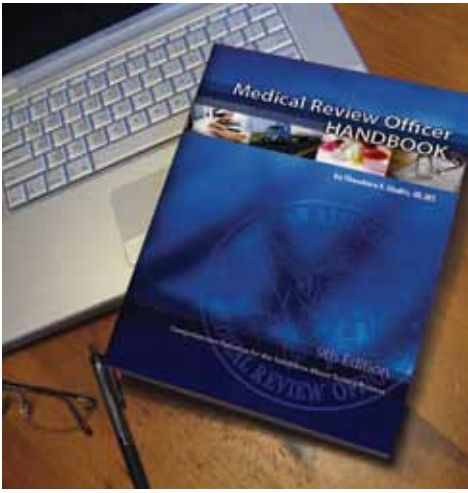

Certification

The American Association of Medical Review

Officers, established in 1992, is a professional medical organization dedicated to formulating national standards and certification of medical practitioners in the field of drug and alcohol testing.

AAMRO certification is recognized as an objective standard of competency and expertise for Medical Review Officers. Candidates certified through AAMRO receive a diploma and are listed in the online searchable Registry of Certified Medical Review Officers, a national industry guide of MROs and their related services.

For nearly 20 years AAMRO certification has been a recognized medical credential. More than 8,000 physicians have been certified by AAMRO as Medical Review Officers. While MRO certification today is voluntary, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has proposed that MRO certification be required for all federal drug testing programs. U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations require that physicians acting as MROs successfully complete an MRO training program and an exam. For non-regulated testing, certification is currently required in Florida and Oklahoma.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the United States Coast Guard (USCG) require current MRO certification for their drug testing programs.

AAMRO Registry

AAMRO-certified Medical Review Officers are listed in a searchable registry at www.aamro.com, which is used

by laboratories, employers, medical credentialing boards, government, and individuals needing MRO services. MROs in good standing can update their profiles online. The registry makes it easier for clients to find you. Certification will make you stand out and give clients confidence.

Certification Requirements

AAMRO's certification examination is based upon the federal requirements developed by the Department of Health and Human Services for federal drug testing programs. MROs must possess a Medical Degree or Degree in Osteopathic Medicine. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the U.S. Department of Transportation hold this requirement for their mandatory drug testing programs.

To be certified by AAMRO as a Medical Review Officer, each candidate must possess:

- A Medical Doctor (M.D.) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (D.O.) degree.
- A current state medical license.
- Documentation of attendance at an approved MRO training program (including ASAM or ACOEM).
- A passing score on the AAMRO written certification exam.

AAMRO certification is intended to be the standard of quality service and ethical conduct by qualified professionals involved in drug and alcohol testing.

Recertification

Physicians certified by AAMRO must recertify in five years to remain in good standing. Effective October 1, 2010, DOT regulations require all certified Medical Review Officers to maintain their certification and "re-qualify" (i.e., recertify) every 5 years. To re-qualify an MRO must attend a comprehensive MRO training program and pass the requalification exam.

The recertification process demonstrates that MROs are current in their knowledge and performance of the essential duties of MROs. It is designed to inform and assess the MRO's knowledge of rule changes, current practices and procedures and technical issues. The exam is both a self-evaluation and an MRO diagnostic tool.

The recertification exam may be completed online. Participants select a date to take the exam and have a specified time limit in which to complete it. This is an open-book exam. Applicable study materials are noted on the application and may be ordered through AAMRO online for your convenience.

Physicians currently certified or recertified by AAMRO are listed as 'In Good Standing' in the AAMRO Registry of Certified Medical Review Officers.

General Information

AAMRO's training programs and exams prepare and certify physicians as Medical Review Officers for regulated and non-regulated workplace drug testing programs. Participants receive a copy of the *Medical Review Officer Handbook* and extensive course reference notes and copies of slide presentations.

Collector Training for MROs (4 hours): OPTIONAL

This program provides MROs guidance and training in the procedures required by Department of Transportation (DOT) and Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) regulated urine specimen collections.

Learning Objectives:

- Knowledge about Part 40 collection procedures.
- All the steps necessary to conduct a proper collection.
- How to properly fill out a federal collection form (Custody and Control Form, or CCF).

- How to handle problem collections (shy bladder, attempts to tamper with the test, etc.).
- Information about fatal and correctable flaws in collections and collection paperwork.
- The collector's responsibility for maintaining the integrity and credibility of the collection process, privacy, and specimen security.

After the training program, the collector-to-be must then complete five consecutive error-free mock collections under the direct observation of a leading trainer in the field.

Note: This training qualifies the attendee as a "collector" and does not provide qualifications as a "trainer."

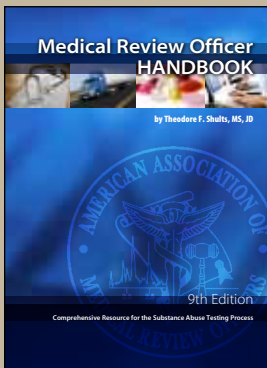
