

American Association of Medical Review Officers Launches MRO Industry Portal with Online Recertification Testing

RESEARCH TRIANGLE PARK, NC, February 2008 — The American Association of Medical Review Officers (AAMRO) today announced the launch of its MRO Center (www.aamro.com), the online industry portal for Medical Review Officers.

AAMRO is the leading medical organization providing education, testing, certification and standards for medical review officers—licensed physicians who receive, review and interpret urine, hair, oral fluid and sweat patch drug test results, monitoring drugs of abuse on behalf of employers, federal agencies, the courts and healthcare providers. AAMRO has certified more than 5,500 physicians from nearly a dozen nations as medical review officers.

The MRO Center portal is the premier membership-based online information and resource site for the MRO industry. Members receive the lauded *eMROAlert* Journal, the voice of the MRO industry, which is published and electronically distributed 10 times per year. These digitally-signed electronic transcripts are maintained regardless of whether members change jobs or organizations.

"This is a dedicated, talent group of physicians who work hard for positive change in society, in substance abuse and employment policies, and most importantly, in people's lives," said Ted Shults, JD, MS, chairman of AAMRO.
